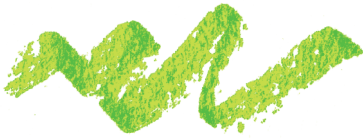

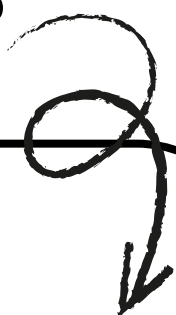

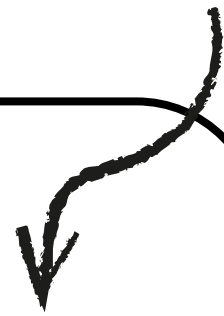
Lectern 1 - 1100 -1700

Warley Place's fishing lake was first designed to provide food.



Lectern 2 - 1700 -1900

Brentwood's train track, Three Arches Bridge and Seven Arches Bridge, built in 1840, were considered to be outstanding examples of engineering.



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Lectern 3 - 1900 -1939

The 'Selo' factory (later 'Illford Limited') on Woodman Road, produced rolls of film from 1912 to 1983.

Lectern 4 - 1939 - 1970

In 1940, the people of Brentwood fundraised enough money to buy a Spitfire plane, which was named 'Brentwood'.

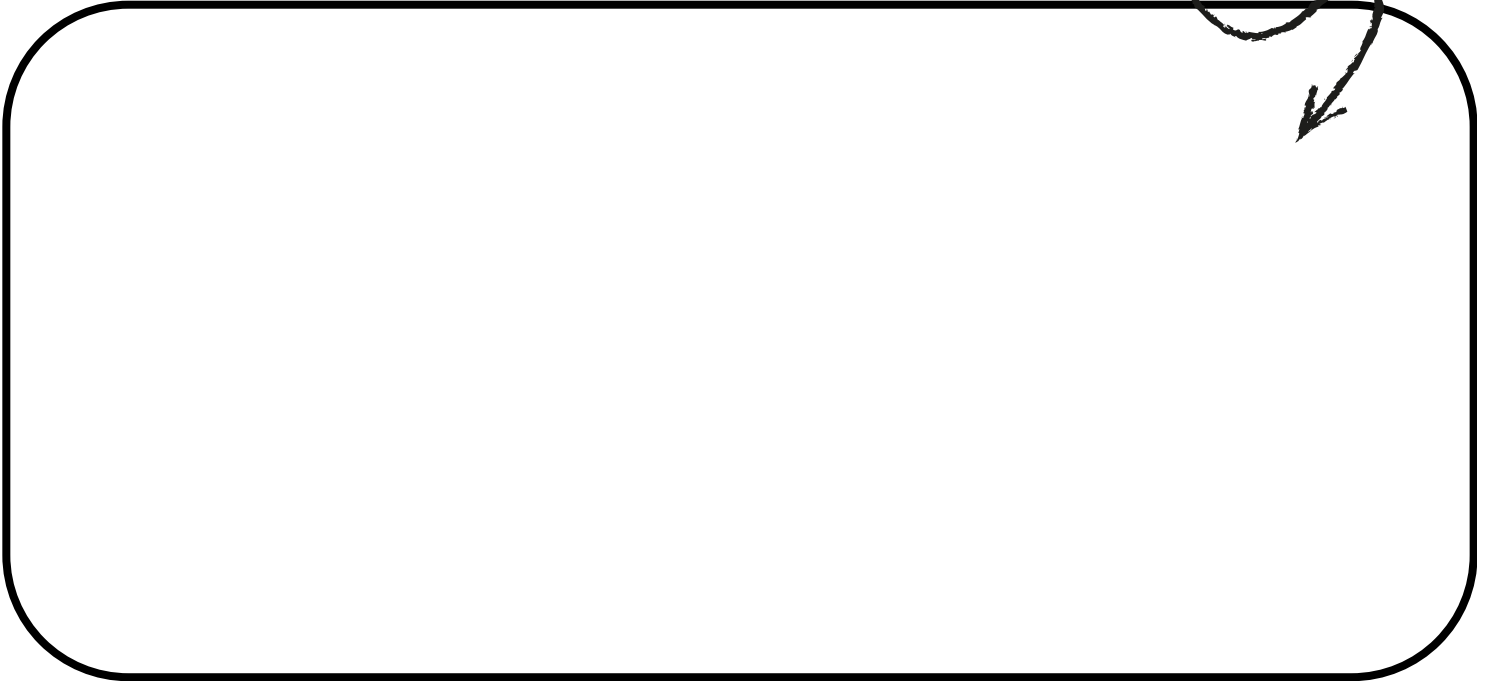
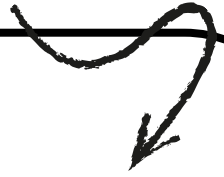

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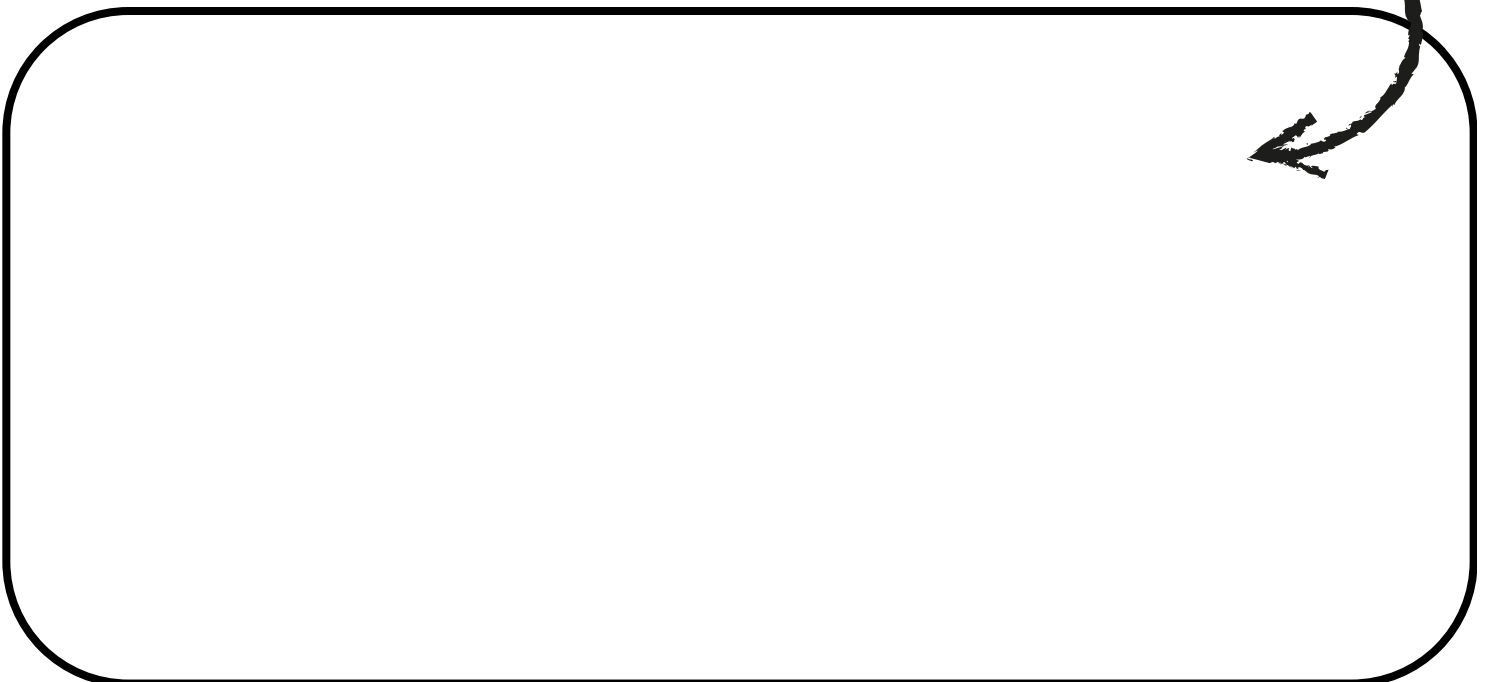
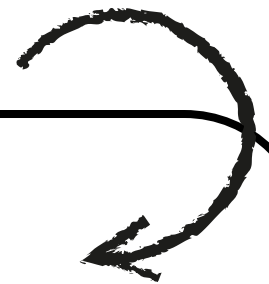
Lectern 5 - 1970 - 1995
