

## Brentwood Borough Infrastructure Funding Statement 2022/23

April 2023

## Introduction

This Infrastructure Funding Statement sets out income and expenditure relating to section 106 (S106) agreements for the year 2022/23. All authorities are required to produce an infrastructure funding statement on an annual basis. This is Brentwood Borough Council's second infrastructure funding statement.
