Welcome

And so ends another challenging year in local government. As we moved a year on from the pandemic, we continued to feel the effects of the trauma to our economy.

Then, just over a year ago, Putin ordered the terrible invasion on Ukraine with all that ensued, including the pressure of those who

fled the country migrating to the UK, needing to be accommodated. The resultant surge in fuel prices, materials and goods, causing a cost-ofliving crisis.

The response of the Brentwood community has, once again, been a terrific effort of compassion and they are to be commended. Our cost-of-living action plan is comprehensive and ever evolving and I hugely value the work of our staff, partners and voluntary sector in supporting the Brentwood community when they need it most. Despite all of this, the council has remained as dedicated as ever to our 5 key priorities set in the Corporate Strategy:

A huge achievement this year was the completion of our first strategic housing development site at Crescent Road. Work on site at Brookfield Close, our next scheme, will commence in Spring 2023 and the planning permission granted for Harewood Road was another milestone of achievement. We are living in a housing crisis so we must continue to drive this agenda hard for those that need decent homes.

Our strategic partnership with Rochford District Council has progressed as we continued to build in resilience and capacity as an authority. The partnership will become one of the key tools in the medium term to grapple with continued cost inflation and restricted income. This partnership demonstrates our commitment to remain innovative and forward thinking with our service delivery, whilst maintaining everything that is distinct about Brentwood. I commend our officers and staff for the efforts they have put into this transition whilst successfully maintaining their

commitment to Brentwood's residents.

I am pleased that the sound commercial decisions we have taken in the past are now paying dividends, to see us through this ambitious period of regeneration as we seek to invest in our town centre and support our local economy. I am excited about the prospect of a Buisness Improvement District later this year and am hopeful this will empower our businesses to shape a business environment that works for them.

Everything we are doing is being noticed. We are building a reputation, as planned, that we are 'open for business'. Investors are looking at our 'can do' attitude and that, coupled with the unique assets Brentwood has to offer, will continue to present the Borough with some fantastic opportunities ahead.

- Monitoring data on housing delivery shows an uplift in completions and significantly more supply (7-years housing supply)
- Major development schemes are progressing as applications, including strategic housing and employment land at Dunton Hills Garden Village and Brentwood Enterprise Park, with determination expected by March 2023

Create a Community Infrastructure Levy to secure funds from new development for local services and infrastructure

- Public consultation on the CIL Draft Charging Schedule concluded (Nov 2022)
- Consultation representations are being reviewed to inform final version for submission, followed by an examination-in public before adoption later in 2023


Deliver a programme of enlivenment events that boost footfall in our high streets



Develop an Environmental Strategy for the Strategy approved following public consultation. A replacement Climate & Sustainability Officer, who will be responsible for delivering this strategy, has also been appointed

Continue to implement phase one of EV Chargers Roll Out in Council Car Parks and pursue on-Street EV chargers with Essex **County Council**

3 chargers installed in Town Hall South Car Park. In addition the council is working to add another 18 chargers including nine at King Georges Playing Fields and a further nine at Chatham Way Car Park. Work to install these chargers will begin in March with the chargers set to be operational by May 2023

Tree planting schedule approved and tree planting event

Implement the Tree Planting Programme landscapes as part of future planting and planning applications, and encourage involvement in tree planting from volunteers and schools

delivered. 12,000 trees for planting in Hutton Country Park in February

Develop management plans for Brentwood Borough Council's Country parks to include biodiversity and education

Investigation into the establishment of trial 'Friends of...' groups agreed. Our tree planting programme will also incorporate an educational element around stewardship etc. Looking to undertake an engagement programme in spring

Promote and work with environmental. regional bodies including other Councils and ASELA to develop wider cross boundary initiatives that influence a positive change towards the environmental agenda

Work is on-going with partners and stakeholders to consult and develop the draft Environment Strategy, ensuring the policy of the draft Council strategy aligns with regional and national strategic objectives. The Council continues to play an active role within ASELA on the shaping of environmental projects, such as SEE Park
